For the past few years, Jim Bannister has taken a moment at each meeting to honor a member of the military from South Carolina who died in service to their country. It is my honor and privilege to assume that mantle, and while I have no expectation of achieving the high bar that Jim set, I hope that I can do the content justice.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to Army First Lieutenant Trevarius Ravon Bowman 25, of Spartanburg, who died May 19, 2020 at Bagram Air Force Base, Afghanistan. Lieutenant Bowman was assigned to Company B, 198th Signal Battalion of the National Guard, out of Newberry, South Carolina.

Lieutenant Bowman earned a bachelor's degree in information management systems from the University of South Carolina Upstate and joined the university's Palmetto College campus as an IT specialist in 2018.
