Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to Specialist Ember M. Ault, of Beech Island, who died of wounds suffered when enemy forces attacked their unit on June 18, 2013, in Bagram, Afghanistan. Specialist Ault was with the 68th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 43rd Sustainment Brigade, 4th Infantry Division based in Fort Carson Colorado. During her service, Specialist Alt was awarded the Bronze Star, Purple Heart Medal and the Combat Action Badge.

Specialist Alt graduated from Killeen High School in 2009 in Texas where she excelled in track. One of her crowning moments is where she helped lead her team to the State finals her senior year.

Her high school track coach had this to say about her:

"I think the Army was a good fit for Ember, she wasn't for sure what else she wanted to do. She was a very loving person. Always had hugs for everyone. I could see her serving her country and giving everything, she had like she did here in school.

"This is last thing I ever thought about," he added. "When kids join, you just don't think about (this happening). I know you should, but I never thought about that for Ember."

As an indication of our respect for Specialist Alt and others who gave their lives for our country, the club places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

Specialist Alt, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf.

J. Scott Lee Co-founder and Retired Executive Director Association for Core Texts and Courses

Scott has been involved in liberal arts education as a student, teacher, accreditor, researcher, entrepreneur, administrator, and – now – as a retiree. His father, president of a chemical manufacturing association, and his mother, a docent at the Minneapolis Art Institute, insisted that he attend a liberal arts college. To St. Olaf College he went. From there he traveled to the University of Chicago, where he earned a Ph.D. from the Committee on the History of Culture, while he, also, ran a physics and chemistry library on campus.

Moving to Princeton with his wife, Geraldine Mooney, son, and son-to-be, the family settled in for a 25-year stay. After a stint at the New York Public Library (of *Ghostbusters* fame), he came to teach in Temple University's English department and Intellectual Heritage Program (a required two-course sequence of great works, from ancient to modern times, across the arts and sciences that all Temple students took.)

At Temple he co-founded the Association for Core Texts and Courses, an international, non-profit organization dedicated to using "the best that has been thought and said in Western and other major civilizations" in undergraduate curricula. Upon retiring in 2018, he published a book, *Invention: The Art of the Liberal Arts*, which seeks to change the fortunes of liberal arts education in America for the better.

After a visit to Geri's mother in Seabrook's Shelter Cove in 1986, the family returned repeatedly to SBI for summer vacations. They purchased a home in 2019, where grandchildren now come to visit. Scott and Geri split their time between Vermont and Seabrook.
