Tonight, we're paying tribute to Chief Warrant Officer Curtis Scott "Skinny" Reagan of Summerville, who died March 29, 2013 in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Chief Warrant Officer Reagan was with the 603rd Aviation Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, stationed at Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. He graduated from Summerville High School and played football there. Scott had just been accepted to University of South Carolina School of Law before he died. He was a devoted husband, father, brother and mentor, and he loved to fly.

A friend of Warrant Officer Reagan had this to say about him:

"Skinny from the first time you met him ...was different. Loved learning from him. Loved making him laugh. Too many stories to mention. Great family man and loved his country. He would do anything for anyone. Sometimes it got him in trouble, and he would just smile, saying it was worth it.

Warrant Officer Reagan was so loved and respected by his colleagues that the Army Health Clinic on Hunter Army Airfield was named in his honor and memory.

As an indication of our respect for Chief Warrant Officer Reagan and others who gave their lives for our country, the club places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

Chief Warrant Officer Reagan, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf.

He is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, Law Enforcement Executive Development School, FBI National Executive Institute, Major Cities Chiefs Association Police Executive Leadership Institute, Police Executive Research Forum Senior Management Institute for Police, and is an active member of the Fraternal Order of Police. In addition to the aforementioned accomplishments, Chief Reynolds currently serves as the Executive Director of the FBI National Executive Institute Associates.

Chief Reynolds believes in effective and meaningful problem solving efforts driven by data and collaboration with our communities and many partners. Public trust and consistent community outreach/engagement and meaningful communication help the police place the proper resources at the right time, in the right places and with the most effective strategies, yielding the best possible outcomes. Keeping our communities' safe is an iterative and ongoing process only accomplished through trust, synergy, patience, hard work and always doing the right things for the right reasons.
