TRIBUTE TO SC FALLEN HERO

Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to Sgt. 1st Class Alvin Algernon Boatwright.

Sgt. 1st Class Alvin Algernon Boatwright was born on December 10, 1977 to Reverend Iseral and Mrs. Mary Boatwright. He graduated High School in 1997 from the former Ruffin High School, in Ruffin, South Carolina.

He joined the United States Army in February 1998. After training, he was stationed at Fort Hood in Killeen, Texas. While stationed at Fort Hood, Alvin spent a year in Korea and served two tours of duty during Operation Iraqi Freedom. After his tours in Iraq, he spent three years as a recruiter for the United States Army in Dallas, Texas.

Alvin met Julie Ann Caldwell in 2007, after his second tour in Iraq. They were married July 28, 2009 in Jamaica.

Alvin's love for the military motivated him to leave his recruiting position for active duty. In 2010, he joined the 4th Battalion, 70th Armor Regiment, 170th Infantry Brigade Combat Team in Baumholder, Germany. There, he served as platoon sergeant and was stationed in Afghanistan.

Nate Mosley, a high school friend had these words to say about Alvin: "Sgt. 1st Class Boatwright is the guy people want to be like...If any soldier had an issue, he would not stop until that soldier's issue was taken care of. Every soldier that he came in contact with wanted to be just like him."

Sgt. 1st Class Alvin Algernon Boatwright died on Saturday, June 18, 2011 along with 3 other soldiers when their vehicle was involved in a rollover in Uruzgan province, Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom. Their vehicle was attempting to cross a stretch of the Helmand River when it rolled over.

Lt. Col. David Oeschger, commander of 4th Battalion, recalled how the other soldiers in the unit, helped by Afghan and Australian soldiers, struggled to save their colleagues from the rushing river. When they realized they could not, they stood guard until the last body was flown out and the vehicle was recovered.

First Lt. Lonnie Townsend recalled Boatwright as the backbone of the Platoon and how his fellow soldiers continued to try to save him and the others, even after they were told to stop. You never gave up; he continued. If Sergeant 1st Class Boatwright were here today, he would tell you that you did a phenomenal job and did everything you could.


Sgt. 1st Class Boatwright was 33 years old.

A friend had this to say at his memorial: "You are our hero Alvin and we will never forget you. You left this world much too soon, but you did it defending the country you loved so. May you rest in God's blessed care, until again reunited with those left to cherish your wonderful memory."



Derek Fyfe MD, PhD Waterproof



Derek's professional carrier was as a Professor of Pediatric Cardiology for 10 years at MUSC in Charleston and for 18 Years at Egleston Children's Hospital at Emory University in Atlanta. He was Director of the Pediatric Cardiology Imaging and of the sub-specialty fellowship training program. He has published

extensively in the academic literature.

Derek and his wife Inger have owned property on Seabrook since 2005 and retired to live here full time in 2012. He started swimming after he retired and trained in open water swimming.

He has completed the Charleston 2.4-mile Low Country Splash nine times, the 3 mile Beaufort River swim race twice and swum 2.5 miles across Lake Washington in Seattle. He is a certified US Masters Adult Learn To Swim Coach and Certified Trainer for Swim Lessons University.

He joined Waterproof Inc in 2014 and has been CEO and Director of Waterproof Inc since 2018. Derek is a member of the Exchange Club. Water Safety Syllabus. September 2023. Be Water Wise!

- 1. Permission. Never go in water without parental permission.
- Never go into the water alone. Even with a lifeguard present you are not completely safe alone.
- 3. Never go in the water without an adult. Make sure the adult is close by and watching you, not staring at a cell phone!
- 4. Look before you leap! Don't jump or dive into water when you can't see the bottom and don't know how deep it is as you can get injured.
- 5. How deep is the water, can you tell? Is it deeper than your chest?
- 6. How cold is the water? Too cold for too long may lead to hypothermia.
- Is the water moving due to currents or waves? Rip currents in the ocean may drag you out to sea. Rivers can run very fast.
- 8. Think before you sink! Roll onto your back to breathe
- Reach or throw don't go. Don't jump in the water to save someone as you might drown when they grab you. Throw something that floats, e.g.a cooler, an empty gallon plastic bottle on a rope.
- 10. Wear a life vest if you can't swim especially in the ocean and always when in any boat. Ocean swimming is harder than pool swimming!
- 11. Don't play "who can hold their breath underwater the longest" breath holding games. Don't hyperventilate before breath holding as it removes the trigger to breathe and you may pass out under water..
- 13. Drains . Never dive down near a drain. Never swim underwater in a hot tub as long hair may get sucked into the drain.
