TRIBUTE TO SC FALLEN HERO

Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to Army PFC Cheziray Lashawn Pressley.

Army PFC Cheziray Lashawn Pressley of North Charleston had been in Afghanistan for just a few days. He was assigned to the Brigade Troops Battalion, 1st Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 25th Infantry Division out of Fort Wainwright, Alaska.

On May 16th, 2011, PFC Pressley was part of a NATO force that was seeking out Taliban strongholds in Zabul Province, Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom when insurgents attacked their unit using improvised explosive devices. One of the devices tore into Pressley's vehicle, killing him and three other NATO soldiers. Pressley was 21 years old.

On Friday, May 27^h 2011, PFC Pressley's remains arrived at Charleston Air Force Base. The 187th Ordnance Battalion performed full planeside honors. His service was held at the Charleston Area Convention Center on Monday, May 30th, 2011, Memorial Day.

At the service, Lillie Boyd, PFC Pressley's aunt described her feelings. "Just an empty void in my life right now," she says. Her grief is tempered with happy memories of the fun-loving boy everyone knew as "Chezzy." "He always had a smile on his face."

Raymond Pressley, his father, said, "He was a fun-loving young man" and that joining the military "was something he really wanted to do - to serve his country, complete his education and see the world. He had a sense of patriotism and duty."

Pressley's 11-year-old brother, King said "He was my brother, but he was also my friend. He did a lot for me. I will miss him very much,"

PFC Pressley was the second of four sons born to Raymond and Jirlie Pressley. He attended high school in Abbeville before the family moved to Charleston in 2007. There he graduated from Fort Dorchester High School in 2008, and studied for two years at Strayer University before joining the Army.

PFC Pressley leaves behind a wife, a daughter, parents, brothers, aunts and uncles. A friend left this note on his online memorial: Cheizray gave the ultimate sacrifice and will be held in the hearts of Americans forever. I cannot and will not let our fallen heroes be forgotten. My deepest sympathy to you. "Some gave all."

In recognition of Pressley's service, Maj. Gen. Alan Lynn awarded PFC Pressley with the Purple Heart, Bronze Star and NATO Medal. Pressley was also promoted to private first class before a crowd of about 600 people at the memorial ceremony.

Lynn had these words to say about Pressley. "Your loss is our loss, too. He was a brother, a fellow soldier. Pressley was absolutely fearless and looked true evil in the eye. He was always ready for combat. Cheziray Lashawn Pressley is an American hero. Because of sacrifices like his, we live in the greatest nation in the world"

As an indication of our respect for PFC Cheziray Lashawn Pressley and others who gave their lives for our country, the club places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

PFC Cheziray Lashawn Pressley, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf.

As the Executive Director of the Board of Voter Registration and Elections, Isaac has assumed a pivotal role in overseeing and guiding the electoral processes in Charleston County.

Isaac's tireless efforts to enhance election administration and accessibility have garnered him widespread respect within the state's election community. His outstanding contributions were nationally recognized when he was honored with the United States Election Assistance "Clearie" Award, a prestigious national clearinghouse award, specifically for his outstanding work in fostering the "Partnership at the Polls" initiative, which encompasses the impactful programs of "Adopt a Polling Location" and "Day for Democracy".

In 2022, Isaac played a pivotal role in passing a landmark reform bill that ushered in early voting in South Carolina.

Isaac's dedication to excellence has earned him the coveted "Excellence in Elections" award from the State of South Carolina, an accolade he has received twice. In 2017, he was recognized for expanding absentee voting and driving higher voter participation through the innovative "Your Vote, Our Veterans" program. In 2021, he was commended for his instrumental role in implementing a Satellite Voting Unit for early voting and spearheading outreach initiatives.

In August of the current year, Isaac was also honored with the J. Mitchell Graham Memorial Award from the South Carolina Association of Counties for his resourceful approach to mitigating poll worker shortages on Election Day.

At the national level, Isaac's exceptional leadership and expertise have garnered widespread recognition. He serves as the vice chair on the National Association of Counties' elections subcommittee and plays a pivotal role as one of the legislative chairs for the National Association of Election Officials. In addition, Isaac is a valued member of the Board of Advisors for the United States Election Assistance Commission and brings his insights to the Bipartisan Policy Center Elections Task Force, further contributing to the advancement of sound electoral practices.

Isaac holds a BA in Political Science from Wheaton College (IL) and remains steadfast in his commitment to safeguarding every citizen's right to vote while offering unwavering support to election officials in their crucial work.
