TRIBUTE TO SC FALLEN HERO

Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to Staff Sergent Andrew S. Bubacz. (Pronounced "Boo-bahtch")

Staff Sargent Andrew S. Bubacz was born in Sumter, SC on September 15, 1987 to Patrick and Linda Bubacz of Dalzell, SC. He was known as a loving and caring person to everyone. They said he could make friends with a tree. He would talk to anyone and with his outgoing personality, he made lasting friendships with the neighbors. He loved music and could play several instruments. It was said that everyone knew when Andrew came into a room because it lit up like a Christmas tree.

Staff Sargent Bubacz enlisted in the Air Force Sept. 27, 2005. He attended basic military training at Lackland AFB, Texas, then transitioned to the 336th Training Squadron at Keesler AFB, Miss., for technical school as a communications specialist. He earned Community College of the Air Force degrees in both biology and information management, as well as an associate degree in biology from Western Oklahoma State College.

Staff Sargent Andrew S. Bubacz was later assigned to the 97th Communications Squadron at Altus Air Force Base, Oklahoma. He had been in Afghanistan for one month of a 270-day deployment when his team was assigned to perform mission critical maintenance on the forward operating base's communications tower in Nuristan Province, Afghanistan. During the operation, Staff Sargent Andrew S. Bubacz suffered a head injury. He was flown to the hospital at Bagram Air Base, where he was pronounced dead on November 12, 2010. He was 23 years old.

"I am deeply saddened by the loss of Sergeant Bubacz," said Col. Ty Thomas, 97th Air Mobility Wing commander. "Andrew will be truly missed by our wing and community. My heart goes out to his family and to all those who knew him well here."

On April 7, 2011, Staff Sergent Andrew S. Bubacz's sacrifice was memorialized when members of the Altus AFB in Oklahoma dedicated a memorial bench and renamed a street in his honor.

As an indication of our respect for Staff Sergent Andrew S. Bubacz and others who gave their lives for our country, the club places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

Staff Sergent Andrew S. Bubacz, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf.

Jason and Jennifer Schall



Jason and Jennifer Schall are competitive saltwater, freshwater and fly-fishing anglers. They each hold multiple Saltwater and Freshwater Angler of the Year titles, and together have achieved over 100 world records. Jason was the first American to win the International Game Fish Association (IGFA) Outstanding Sportsmanship Award. Jennifer holds the distinction of catching one of the largest freshwater fish world records ever certified by the IGFA. Together they have caught over 750 unique species on rod and reel.

The Schalls are champions for conservation of marine resources, with both having received recognition by the Department of Natural Resources for their work. When not competing in tournaments or traveling in pursuit of new species, they use their roles as Certified Fishing Instructors to teach the basics of fishing to children and adults through their many clinics and seminars. In recent years, they have both received top rankings among male and female anglers in the annual World Record Game Fish book. Jason and Jennifer currently reside in their hometown of Charleston, South Carolina.
